

You must submit original content that has not been published elsewhere. If you have written something for another *BDJ* publication, e.g. *BDJ Student* magazine, please contact the editorial team to see if it would also be appropriate for publication elsewhere in the *BDJ* Portfolio. If you are successful in getting an article approved for publication, your article must be exclusive to the *BDJ* Portfolio.


BDJ In Practice
